

HOW IS THIS PROGRAMME PRESENTED?

- This programme is only offered full time, over a period of one year.
- The programme is presented in English ONLY.

SELECTION PROCESS:

- Closing date for programme is 31 August 2020
- All applications will, after the closing date, first go through a paper selection process, after which the 'successful' applicants will be invited to the selection day (you will be informed of the dates well in advance).
- Attendance of the selection day is compulsory (no attendance, no selection).
- Applicants who did not make the paper selection will be informed via e-mail.
- Applicants, who were successful during the paper selection, will be invited to the selection day via e-mail.
- Over and above the NWU application fees, successful applicants have to pay a selection fee of R250 to the School of Industrial Psychology and Human Resource Management before they will be allowed to continue with the selection process. An additional form will be sent to these applicants with information regarding the selection day, selection process and payment details.
- Only after the selection day will the final decisions pertaining to admission to the honours degree be made.
- Applicants will be informed via e-mail whether they have been successful or not. Because all results from students may not be available at the selection day, selection will take place subject to the final results being available.
- The result of the selection process is final.
- The selection is only valid for the year in which you apply, and is therefore not transferable to the next year.
- By applying for this qualification, the applicant acknowledges that he/she has read this document and is aware of the fact that he/she will be subjected to a selection process and all the mentioned prerequisites and information associated with it. Furthermore, the applicant also consents to be subjected to psychometrics, interviews and other individual and/or group exercises.

Closing date for Honours in Labour Relations Management is 31 August 2020. No postponement will be granted.

- Applicants are requested to apply online.
