

Montfort Mlachila is the Senior Resident Representative of the International Monetary Fund in South Africa. Until 2016, he was an Advisor in the African Department and mission chief for Gabon and Equatorial Guinea. Prior to that, he was Deputy Chief of the Regional Studies Division, where he was responsible for overseeing the preparation of the department's flagship publication, the *Regional Economic Outlook for Sub-Saharan Africa*.
