1. Who qualifies for postgraduate studies?

- 1.1. Admission requirements for the Magister Commercii (MCom) and Magister Scientiae (MSc) degree
 - a. A student must be in possession of a BA Honours, BSc Honours or BCom Honours degree or have the status of a BA Honours, BSc Honours or BCom Honours degree, as approved by the Senate. The study content of this degree must be to the satisfaction of the Research Committee. In the case of non-South African degrees, see "Guidelines for foreign applicants" (http://www.nwu.ac.za/postgrad/foreign-applicants and http://www.saqa.co.za/).
 - b. The student must have obtained an average of **at least** 65% in his/her Honours or an equivalent four-year degree; and have obtained **at least** 65% in the Honours or four-year degree **modules** upon which the intended studies are based, e.g. Economics/Development Economics/International Trade/Agricultural Economics.
 - c. Since both the MCom and MSc degree are essentially research-based, the research ability of the student must be demonstrated to the satisfaction of the Research Committee.
 - d. Applicants will also need to submit a focused research outline as part of the screening process (http://commerce.nwu.ac.za/sites/commerce.nwu.ac.za/sites/commerce.nwu.ac.za/files/files/TRADE/M%20and%20PhD/MC om%20Focused%20research%20outline.pdf)
 - e. All applications will undergo a review process. Even if the minimum requirements are met, the Research Committee reserves the right to select only a number of applicants, given the available supervision capacity.
 - f. Applicants will be approved on the condition that the student will develop and present a satisfactory research proposal at a TRADE colloquium.
 - g. Since it is expected of our students to be able to do their own data analysis, a good knowledge of Econometrics and/or other modelling/statistical techniques is highly recommended.
- 1.2. Admission requirements for the degree Philosophiae Doctor (PhD)
 - a. A student must be in possession of an applicable Master's degree, or have the status of a Master's degree, as approved by the Senate. The study content of this degree must be to the satisfaction of the Research Committee.
 - In the case of non-South African degrees, see "Guidelines for foreign applicants". (http://www.nwu.ac.za/postgrad/foreign-applicants and http://www.saqa.co.za/).
 - b. A student must have obtained at least 65% for his/her Master's degree.
 - c. Since the PhD degree is essentially a research-based degree, the research ability of the student must be demonstrated to the satisfaction of the Research Committee.
 - d. Applicants will also need to submit a focused research outline as part of the screening process (http://commerce.nwu.ac.za/sites/commerce.nwu.ac.za/files/files/TRADE/M%20and%20PhD/PhD%20Focused%20research%20outline.pdf)
 - e. All applications will undergo a review process. Even if the minimum requirements are met, the Research Committee reserves the right to select only a number of applicants, given the available supervision capacity.

- f. Applicants will be approved on the condition that the student will develop and present a satisfactory research proposal at a TRADE colloquium.
- g. Since it is expected of our PhD students to be able to do their own data analysis, a good knowledge of Econometrics and/or other modelling/statistical techniques is highly recommended.

Step 2:

Develop a focused research outline which will aid the assessment committee in pairing you with a suitable supervisor who works in your intended field of study.

Step 3:

Complete the form NWU application form, your focused research outline and attach your academic record. If you are applying to be <u>admitted</u> to the North-West University for the <u>first time</u>, or you are not currently registered as a student at the North-West University, you need to pay a non-refundable application fee in the amount of <u>R150-00</u> (<u>R550-00</u> in the case of students who are not South African citizens) to the NWU. This can be done through an electronic payment, which is made into the North-West University's bank account. The account "NWU DIVERSE" must be used and the account details are as follows:

Step 5:

After the closing date for applications, a paper selection will be done. Successful candidates will be notified in writing.

Note that the Research Committee will review the applications again at the end of May 2018 and you should not expect feedback before then. Any late applicants will have to wait for the next meeting of the Committee. In the beginning of the year, you will also be invited to a *Mini colloquium for postgraduate students* where you will be able to present your research problem (topic), meet other postgraduate students and obtain more information on your intended studies.

Step 5:

Please note that you are not allowed to register until your research proposal has been presented and approved by the Research Committee. However, you may register for a once-off, six-month period as an "intentional postgraduate student" in order to obtain access to the library and all the other information resources. This can be done by contacting Ms Georgene Mulder at the Ferdinand Postma Library (tel no +27 18 299 2718 or e-mail georgene.mulder@nwu.ac.za). The cost will be R250.00 if you are in possession of a student card; if not the cost will be R290.00.
