All undergraduate students who register at the University for the first time, must report, at a time and place determined by the University, for compulsory proficiency tests in academic literacy in order to evaluate their ability to function in an academic environment. The purpose of the test is to identify students who, due to insufficient academic skills, run the risk of not completing their study programme successfully within the allowed period.

Students, who are identified as risk cases by the test, must register for the module AGLA 111 (Afrikaans) or AGLE111 (English). These modules will not be considered for credit purposes in curricula, but the credits awarded in these modules will count as additional credits. AGLA121 / AGLE121 (depending on the student's preferred or working language) is a compulsory module for all students registering at the University for the first time. This module carries a weight of 12 credits and forms part of the curriculum that the student has registered for. A student who passed the compulsory test in academic literacy has admission to AGLA121 / AGLE121. A student who first had to complete AGLA111 / AGLE111 had to have obtained a final mark of at least 40% for AGLA111 / AGLE111 in order to obtain admission to AGLA121 / AGLE121.

Students will be charged for these modules.

(In terms of the National Credit Act, 34 of 2005, compound interest at 4% above the prime lending rate of the University's bankers, calculated from the date on which they were due, will be calculated on all amounts in arrear. This interest rate does not exceed the maximum rate as prescribed in this Act.)

* A cost estimate for study and boarding fees for an ensuing year can at most be done on a pro forma basis. This means that the cost estimate is done approximately and only as to set out minimum requirements. The cost estimate is therefore only a guideline and not a formal offer/agreement or invoice. In the higher education context, no agreement is entered into between the NWU and the student before the student is registered as such with the NWU. The student may be accepted beforehand as part of a logistical exercise, but an agreement is only concluded when the student registers with the NWU for the specific services the NWU renders. In anticipation of this agreement, the NWU may issue a pro forma estimate indicating the expected cost, subject to final determination.

** Meals at the University are handled strictly on a cash basis. This means that you will only be able to use the credit available on your Eduxtra card. The card may be used on campus at the Student centre, Checkers and at Pick and Pay. The NWU recommends an amount of R800 per month. The amount may however be determined by yourself.
