Please note that the content of the BA Honours and the BCom Honours programmes is identical. If you have completed your BCom undergraduate degree, you can apply for a BCom Honours; and if you have completed your BA undergraduate degree, you can apply for a BA Honours.

REQUIREMENTS & SELECTION:

How do I apply for my honours degree?

- Applicants are requested to apply online.
- The North-West University (NWU) application form, together with all the necessary information, is available on the NWU web page at:

<http://studies.nwu.ac.za/studies/apply>

- Students from other universities have to ensure that all documentation as requested is attached to the application form. The School of Industrial Psychology and Human Resource Management emphasises the importance of the following documentation without which the application cannot be processed:
 - Official academic record(s).
 - Specific outcomes (aims) of modules/content covered in previous qualification(s).
- The closing date for the Honours in Labour Relations Management is 31 August each year.
- Late applications will not be considered.

VERY IMPORTANT: Make sure that all email addresses and telephone numbers on your application form are correct. The School of Industrial Psychology and Human Resource Management will contact you on the email address as shown on your application form. If this information is incorrect or not available, you will not receive the necessary information to enable you to successfully complete the selection process. The school will then also not be able to accommodate you if you (because of this) do not attend the selection or if you have missed any other important information.

What are the requirements that I have to adhere to in order to apply for my Honours in Labour Relations Management?

The following modules are considered when applying for an Honours in Labour Relations Management:

IOPS 311 (minimum of 60%)	Organisational Psychology
IOPS 321 (or PSYC 312) (minimum of 60%)	Psychometrics and Research Methodology
LARM 111 or LARM 112	Introduction to Workplace Relations OR Introduction to International Labour Organisation
LARM 211 OR LARM 212	Occupational Management OR Diversity Management
LARM 221	Work Group Dynamics
LARM 311 (minimum of 60%)	Theory and Practice of Labour Relations
LARM 321 (minimum of 60%)	Management of Labour Relations
LARM 322 (minimum of 60%)	Conflict Resolution
STTN 111	Descriptive Statistics
STTN 124	Practical Statistics

Please note the following:

- You should have obtained a **combined** average of 60% for the modules above.
- You need a minimum of 60% for IOPS 311 and a minimum of 60% for IOPS 321 in order to apply.
- You need a minimum of 60% for LARM 311, a minimum of 60% for LARM 321, and a minimum of 60% for LARM 322 in order to apply.
- Only a certain number of students can be accommodated annually; therefore, all prospective BCom Honours and BA Honours applicants are subjected to a selection process – you will not be selected based on your academic performance alone.
- Doing practical hours in your undergraduate degree is not a prerequisite to apply for your honours degree.

How is this programme presented?

- This programme is only offered full-time over a period of one year on the Potchefstroom and Mahikeng campuses; however, it is offered full-time over a period of one year, and part-time over a period of two years on the Vanderbijlpark Campus, class attendance is compulsory.
- The programme is presented in English ONLY.
