Requirements and selection

Please note that, as previously mentioned, no late applications will be considered, as there is a selection process. Once the paper selection process has started, our administration office (or honours selection coordinator) will contact you to indicate whether your application will be considered for further review. If you have not received feedback by 30 October, please contact us using the contact details provided above.

- BCom Honours in Labour Relations Management Qualification code: 5EWL01; Curriculum code: E601P/V/M

How do I apply for the honours degree?

- Applicants are requested to apply online.
- The North-West University (NWU) application form, together with all the necessary information, is available on the NWU web page at: http://studies.nwu.ac.za/studies/apply
- Students from other universities must ensure that all requested documentation is attached to the application form. The School of Industrial Psychology and Human Resource Management emphasises the importance of the following documents without which the application cannot be processed:
 - Official academic record(s).
 - Specific outcomes (aims) of modules/content covered in previous qualification(s).
- The closing date for the Honours in Labour Relations Management is 31 August each year.
- Late applications will not be considered.

VERY IMPORTANT: Make sure that all email addresses and telephone numbers provided on your application form are correct. The School of Industrial Psychology and Human Resource Management will contact you using the email address provided on your application form. If this information is incorrect or unavailable, you will not receive the necessary information to successfully complete the selection process. The school will not be able to accommodate you if you fail to attend the selection process or do not receive other essential information as a result.

Requirements to apply for the honours degree in Labour Relations Management

The following modules are considered when applying to do an honours degree in Labour Relations Management:

IOPS 311 (minimum of 60%)	Organisational Psychology
IOPS 321 (or PSYC 312) (minimum of 60%)	Psychometrics and Research Methodology
LARM 111 or LARM 112	Introduction to Workplace Relations OR Introduction to International Labour Organisation
LARM 211 OR LARM 212	Occupational Management OR Diversity Management
LARM 221	Work Group Dynamics
LARM 311 (minimum of 60%)	Theory and Practice of Labour Relations
LARM 321 (minimum of 60%)	Management of Labour Relations
LARM 322 (minimum of 60%)	Conflict Resolution
STTN 111	Descriptive Statistics
STTN 124	Practical Statistics

Please note the following:

- A **combined** average of 60% is required for the modules listed above.
- A minimum of 60% is required for IOPS 311, IOPS 321, or PSYC 312, respectively, to be eligible to apply.
- A minimum of 60% for LARM 311, LARM 321, and LARM 322, respectively, to be eligible to apply.
- Only a certain number of students can be accommodated annually. Therefore, all prospective honours applicants undergo a selection process where academic performance is just one factor considered. You will not be selected based on your academic performance alone.
- Completion of practical hours during your undergraduate degree is not a prerequisite for applying for the honours degree.

Applications

Applications open on 1 May each year.

Applications close on 31 August each year.

Please be advised that due to the selection process, late applications are not accepted.
